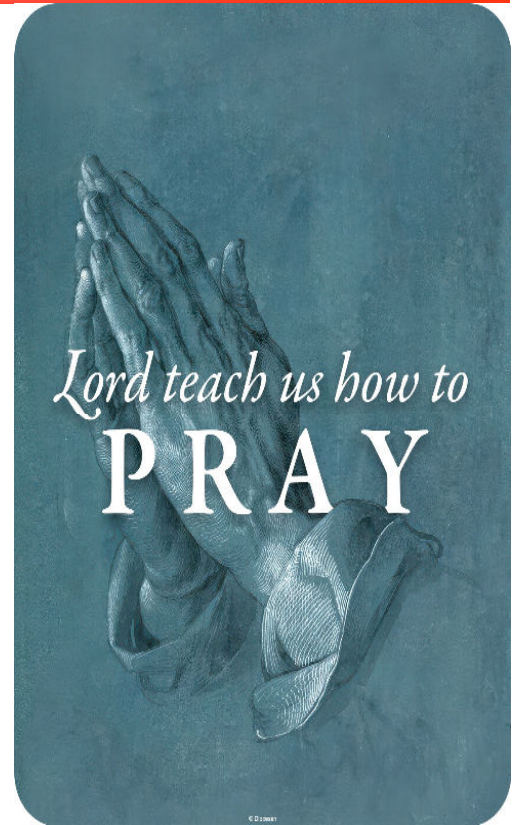

**Introduction**

**Liturgy of the Word**

Before we hear Jesus teach his disciples to pray, we see Abraham persistently petition God to show mercy toward the people of the city of Sodom. In the Gospel, Jesus confirms how important it is to show this kind of persistence. Our Father in heaven, Jesus teaches us, is generous beyond human generosity, having given the Holy Spirit to be with us always, and so we should freely ask for our needs, assured that we will be heard.



**Pastor's Post**



I am sure most of you have taken notice of the beautiful Altar Rail that is now part of the sanctuary at St. Edmond Church. Once again I need to recognize and tip my hat to Conrad Bercier for such beautiful artisanship. He has talent on loan from St. Joseph and Conrad has used his talents to glorify the Lord.

The altar rail is making a comeback in our Catholic Churches. It was so unnecessary to remove them in the first place. Their removal deemphasized the transcendent action taking place at the altar. A sense of awe and reverence when Jesus makes Himself present at the altar is helped by having our senses directed to that action. The altar rail reminds us that we are entering into the “Holy of Holies” in the Church Body.

I'm sure many of you are thinking about “When?” and “How?”. We will begin once the cushions for kneeling at the altar are installed. I will also be meeting with the Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist and the Altar Servers to prepare them. The changes will not be dramatic. One has the option of kneeling at the altar or to remain in line like we have always had. Also, Holy Communion will be distributed under both species. We will have the same amount of Extraordinary Ministers as we have always had.

Banish from your thoughts that Fr. Joe is going to take us back to pre-Vatican II. I don't know Latin. I'm having a hard enough time doing Mass in Spanish. I'm an old dog who can't learn new tricks. Vatican II never told us to get rid of altar rails. That is why we are seeing a return to them in many, many churches in the Diocese of Lafayette. It is a recovery of the beauty and reverence essential in all Catholic Churches.
