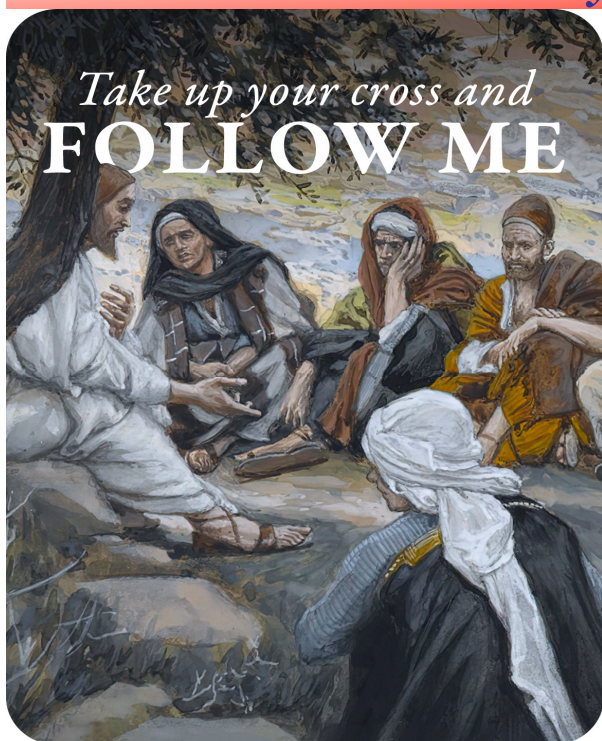

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

Jesus, our teacher, offers lessons today on being a disciple. These lessons can be difficult—we must carry our own crosses, we must renounce all our possessions, we even must hate our own family—but we gather as a family of faith in this place to hear them and reflect on them. The words of Wisdom may help, as they point out that as much as we try, we cannot possibly conceive the mind of God. Therefore, with faith and humility, let us listen to God's word.

Pastor's Post



“Anxiety rehearses disasters. Faith rehearses promises.”

This quotations contains so much truth and yet, if we are honest with ourselves, we tend to live in the context of disasters. Whether real or imagined, disasters or traumas of the past are empowered memories that rob us of joy and keep us locked in the past. Sometimes disasters are rooted in a hyperactive imagination that constantly says “What if?” We can visualize scenarios in our minds that may or may not occur. Either way, we let such musings control our psychological state. Many times the traumas were real. They were painful experiences. They brought about piercing and intense moments of anxiety, sadness, anger and resentment.

Jesus gives us a solution to “Stinking Thinking”. Jesus is the personification and Incarnation of perfect love. When He resides our hearts, we better understand His directive—***Perfect love casts out fear.***” (1 Jn. 4:18). Faithfully following our Blessed Lord invites us to change our outlook and attitude. We no longer rehearse disasters that befall us. Our faith in Jesus allows us to trust Him in the storms of life. We have a quiet confidence that He will deliver us from slavery of sin to the promise of the Resurrection. Anchoring our faith in Christ softens our hardened hearts, helps us to let go of the past, and keeps us with a constant disposition of serenity and joy.
