Also once again, we hear Jesus tell a story to teach the proper attitude toward material wealth. Here, the rich man and Lazarus find their states completely reversed after they die. Let us heed the lessons Amos and Jesus teach us and pray that we never become blind and uncaring to those in desperate need.

Pastor's Post



The month of October is designated as Respect Life month and is also dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. On October 7, 1571 a Christian Navy defeated an extremely powerful Ottoman Empire in the Battle of Lepanto. Against all odds, the Christian navy was victorious. The victory is attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the praying of the rosary.

The Blessed Mother is the head of the Christian army in the spiritual battle. Our best spiritual defense against evil is the recitation of the rosary. Each of us must cultivate a practice of the daily recitation of the rosary. Parents and children ought to be gathered before a statue of the Blessed Mother and pray the rosary.

Perhaps your personal devotional life has gradually declined due to an overwhelming busy schedule or even neglect. Now is the time to recommit and reconnect to Christ through Mary. The First Saturday of every month is also dedicated to Our Lady. We have Mass at 8:30 am every First Saturday. In October, the First Saturday is on October 4th. In addition to having Mass at 8:30 am, we will also have the public recitation of the rosary immediately after Mass at the corner of Ambassador and West Congress. This is our way of publicly asking for Mary's maternal protection over our unborn children, our mothers and fathers, our legislators and judges. The culture of death is still with us. We must be vigilant in our prayers for our nation and the need for conversion of hearts.

We need your presence at our First Saturday Mass and rosary. It is a very small sacrifice to make. Our Catholic faith cannot remain hidden. "We are the light of the world!" Be bold and courageous enough to publicly proclaim your faith and devotion.

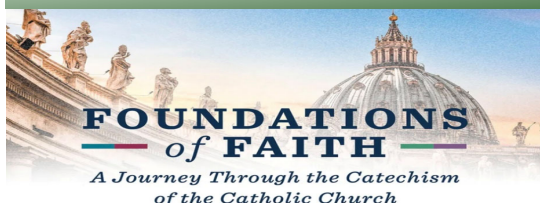
"Gently Worn" School Uniforms Needed
