Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

Twice today we hear the words Isaiah proclaimed hundreds of years before Christ's birth: "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel." This Hebrew name means "God is with us," and when Joseph, a devote and righteous man, is visited by an angel in his dream, he recalls Isaiah's prophecy. We know that God is also with us as we gather here to listen to God's word, and so at this time we allow ourselves to be immersed in God's presence as we actively listen to today's readings.

O little town of Bethlehem
How still we see thee lie.
Above the deep and dreamless sleep.
The silent stars go by
Yet in thy dark streets shineth
The everlasting light
The hopes and fears of all the years
Are met in thee tonight

As Christmas arrives this coming Thursday, this Christmas hymn centered on Bethlehem ought to lift our minds and emotions to the serene and awe-inspiring reality of the Birth of Christ. The Savior is born. We are invited to contemplate the manger scene. "God is with us!" And "God is one of us!"

Bethlehem means "House of Bread." Every Catholic Church is a Bethlehem. Wherever the tabernacle is, there is Jesus—the Bread of Life who dwells with us. Like the shepherds and the Magi, we are invited to bend the knee and gaze upon the Savior of the world.

Our 60 hour devotion will begin on Monday, January 5, 2026. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed Monday through Friday from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm. We need more adorers committed to visit Jesus for an hour in the Adoration Chapel. Many people have signed up. We need more of you. Please look at the list of adorers and their assigned hours of adoration. The list is in the vestibule of the Church on a tripod. If you haven't committed to an hour yet, please consider doing so. Place your name in the time slot you prefer. Ideally we would like two people in each time slot for the 60 hours.

Make your sacrifice of prayer for your family members who are away from the church or are heavily burdened. The Lord invites you to visit Him. He asks you to trust Him. He says "Ask and you shall receive. Seek and you shall find. Knock and it shall be opened to you.




