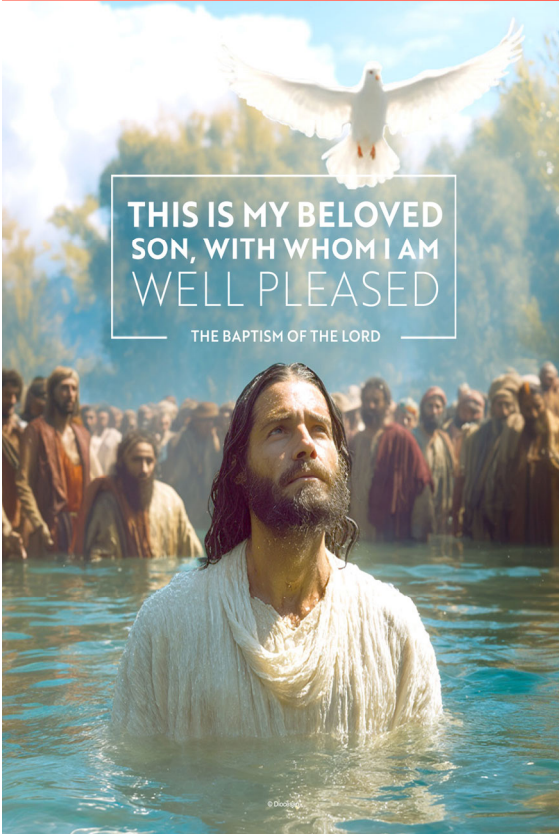

Introduction
to the
Liturgy of the Word

On this final day of the Christmas Season we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We hear in dramatic fashion of Jesus rising from the waters of the River Jordan, the heavens opening before him, the holy Spirit descending like a dove, and a voice from the heavens proclaiming, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” Though not as visibly, we too have risen from the waters of baptism and received the Holy Spirit. Pastor's Post



“I feel the greatest destroyer of peace today is ‘Abortion’, because it is a war against the child...A direct killing of the innocent child, ‘Murder’ by the mother herself...And if we can accept that a mother can kill her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another.”
